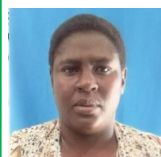

Kasikizi Coal Mine Groundbreaking Ceremony

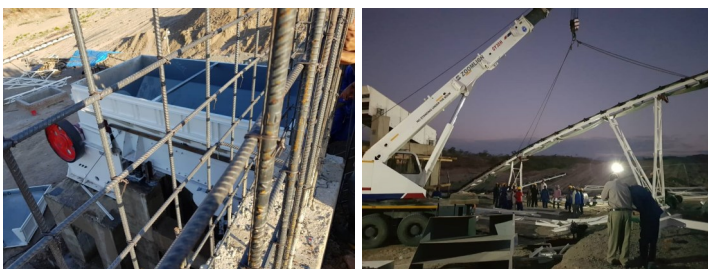


Kasikizi Coal Mines, a venture between Indian investors and Zagaf Cement a Malawian private sector entity was launched in the month of July 2018. The joint venture is worth the amount of US\$2 Million and the plant has the capacity of 20000 tonnes of coal per month.

According to the Managing Director of Kasikizi Coal Mines Mr. K.S. Gurulingaswamy, there are additional plans of setting up a coal fired power plant with a capacity of 50MW which will contribute to the national power grid.

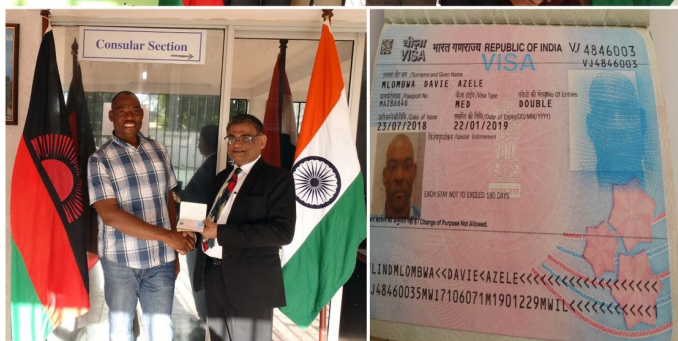
