PUBLIC NOTICE

ATTESTATION/APOSTILLE OF INDIAN DOCUMENTS

India, since 2005, is a member of the Hague Convention of October 5, 1961 that abolished the requirement of legalization of foreign public documents. Apostille is acceptable in 115 member-countries of the Convention (for more info please visit the website: www.hcch.net). Any document apostilled in one member country is acceptable in all the other member-countries, signatory to the referred convention of 1961 thus greatly simplifying the process of attestation by making it needless to get the documents attested in each or for each of the countries separately.

All Indian nationals and persons of Indian origin in Malawi who require to get Indian documents apostilled are informed herewith that these documents should be apostilled in India and the procedure listed in Ministry's website at <http://www.mea.gov.in/apostille.htm> is to be followed. In case the applicant is not in a position to visit India, he/she is advised to nominate some of his/her relatives/friends in India and send the document to him/her to have the Indian document apostilled on his/her behalf in Consular Section, Ministry of External Affairs, New Delhi.
